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### So Zion, What's Next!

A few years ago there was a popular TV series called *The West Wing*. The main character of the show was the President of the United States, Jeb Bartlett, played by Martin Sheen. He had a famous line he often used when one topic was settled and he was ready to move on to the next crisis. "What's Next".

Well, that's just how I feel today. "What's Next".

After our special congregational meeting was held on July 10, 2022, and we voted overwhelmingly to commit our legacy gift funds to three very important property projects, I have given a lot of thought to "What's Next".

We received some very thoughtful comments prior to and during the meeting that have given me pause to think that what we do next will have a major impact on our current situation as a congregation and a lasting impact on our congregation in the future.

At the July 10<sup>th</sup> meeting several of us spoke to the concerns we had with the Nave roof project. It was mentioned that slate roofs, with proper regular maintenance, should last a lot longer than the 50 years of life that our current roof has lived.

The phrase "proper maintenance" stuck with me. After years of working on Zion's budgets, line items for the proper maintenance of our nave slate roof have never appeared in or have been funded in our annual budgets. The idea that we would commit current and benevolence funds to this sort of item, to be honest, is quite foreign to our culture at Zion.

When it comes to funding special projects or emergencies, there is no area congregation more generous than Zion. But to be honest, we regularly fall short in properly funding our every day, or current and benevolence expenses. To be fair, we have made attempts at this by creating an expense line for "Kney Organ maintenance", but funding for the regular maintenance of the building has just never been appropriated in our annual budgets. We have committed money for "building repairs" but allotting money to be used for preventative purposes has eluded our thinking when budget expenses are presented annually for congregational review and approval.

It is abundantly clear that the vast majority of the congregation feels passionately committed to preserving and sustaining our historical location at Church and Sixth Streets. The three projects we voted to fund will go a long way toward the preservation of the building. It is the sustaining of our facility that must now occupy a place in the "What's Next" line of our congregational agenda. And we should make a commitment to add this as a regular budget line item and to fund it appropriately.

A second issue was raised by way of written communication to me concerning the need for Zion to fund an expanded pastoral ministry. It was suggested that we use some of the funds to attract a second pastor to assist us in developing avenues to increase our membership. This increased membership would then, hopefully, allow us to fund the building projects we have prioritized and provide increased revenue sources for future budgets. In looking at past budgets where we funded a full time Pastor, the budget contributions required to fund this exceeded \$90,000. Given our income at today's budget amounts, this would require 56% of our total giving and leave little else for other staff, utilities, insurance and mission expenses. So yes, we would need an influx of cash from our legacy gift to accomplish this, but without our own long term commitment to fund this in our budget, we could not sustain the expenditure for very long. This would make us a poor candidate for any prospective Pastor.

So, let's get back to "What's Next!"

We can start by making budget commitments in 2023 to fund these two critical programs. How can we do this given our current membership? Let's look at some numbers:

Zion currently lists 174 Families (Members with envelope numbers) on our rolls.

Of that 174, we received census data from 124 families stating that they considered themselves to be active members of the congregation.

Of those 124, 78 families are currently listed as giving to Zion's current and benevolence (budget) so far in 2022.

Of those 78, 54 families have made pledge commitments to the 2022 budget.

It's plain to see that we have the potential to do better. Do we have the will to do better? Doing so will give us hope that there is indeed a brighter more robust future for Zion.

Let's make a concerted effort to solving "What's Next!"

#### **Special Congregational Meeting**

**Sunday, July 10, 2022** 

The meeting called to order at 10:45 AM

32 voting members from the congregation were present for the meeting.

A prayer for guidance was offered by member Darla Mechling

Gary Ellenberger and Jim Slade were appointed as tellers by the chair.

A brief background was presented detailing the property committee's work on addressing the three projects.

A motion was made (Dave Keith/Dirk Grafton) to accept the property committee's recommendation to proceed with the bid proposal from Willet Hauser for providing replacement windows for 58 of the church's windows located in the office/pre-school area. These windows, due to their location, are the most seriously deficient.

Discussion was held offering opinion on whether the frosted glass was preferable to clear glass.

The chair offered to have discussion with the contractor on having some of the replacement windows around the pre-school area be changed to clear glass.

A question was raised as to the disposition of the removed stained glass.

The chair stated that the removed stained glass would be saved and could be offered to members of the congregation or sold as architectural savage.

Comment was made asking if any of the windows would be working (sashed) windows.

Comment was made as to whether the lower windows should be eliminated and replaced by matching mason-ry.

The question was called and the vote was cast. The motion passed 29-3.

A motion was made ((Don Seagren/ Kim Balcerak) to accept the property committee's recommendation to proceed with the bid from TMR Roofing on replacing the slate roof on the nave with a look-a-like composite roofing material with a 50 year life guarantee. It was stated that the nave's existing roof was installed in 1972.

Comment was made that slate roofing should last much longer with proper maintenance.

Discussion was held making comment of the lack of proper maintenance to extend the life of the slate roof as a factor in the deteriorating condition of the roof.

Samples of the proposed roofing material were presented for inspection by those attending

A comment was raised as to the new material's ability to withstand a high wind storm.

The chair offered to discuss this concern with the contractor and obtain wind durability information.

The question was called and the vote was cast. The motion passed 27-4 with one abstention.

A motion was made (Kathy Gaylor/Kim Balcerak) to accept the property committee's recommendation to proceed with the bid from Pennington Construction on upgrading the kitchen's ceiling, floor, and electrical system.

After limited discussion, the question was called and the vote was cast. The motion passed 29-3.

With no other business permitted to be addressed at this meeting, the meeting was adjourned at 11:45 AM.

### **Zion's Second Quarter Budget Report**

In reviewing of Zion's current and benevolence giving through June 30, 2022, Zion's income is running ahead of anticipated pledge amounts by 16%. So far, 13 who made pledges to Zion's 2022 budget have successfully reached 100% of their commitments and 20 others are on target through June 2022 at 50% of pledge goal.

Our current and benevolence giving through June 30, 2022 was \$101,420. Zion received current and benevolence giving from 78 of our current giving envelope list during the second quarter. That list consists of 174 envelope numbers. In 2021 we received current and benevolence contributions from 101 envelope numbers.

Total budget income from all sources through June 30, 2022 was \$106,661.71.

Total expenses ending June 30, 2022 was \$75,004.16, giving us a second quarter surplus of \$31,657.52.

Total monies in Zion's various dedicated accounts are: \$137,697.04.

Zion's endowment funds stand at: \$105,845.37

Zion has received income from our Endowment Fund investments of \$2,147.88 in 2022.

Zion's capital improvement fund has a balance of: \$21,913.27

This leaves Zion with operating cash of: \$129,391.17.

We can all rejoice that we are meeting the needs of our 2022 budget plan. However, we must remember that future growth of our ministries will require a greater commitment from the congregation to be achieved.

We urge you all to continue to provide your support for Zion and our ministries as you are able to do so. Zion's council and its committees will continue to stay committed to our budget plan as we progress through 2022.

- Pastors' Report- Synod meeting addressed several issues, such as the reorganization of the ELCA, it's position on guns. There was a speaker who was a Chaplain. "Chaplain of Chaplains", they are in charge of all ELCA Chaplains. The Synod budget was approved. The Constitution was updated. There was a wedding on Saturday. Experiment with worshiping outside at next Saturday's service. Synod meeting- B. Slade- Flyer for ways to give to Ukrainian who is affiliated with Lutherlyn- will be posted in the bulletin. Zion received a mission support certificate from 2021.
